

**County Administration Workshop: April 7, 2016**

**9:00 a.m. – Board Conference Room**

Attending: Commissioners Cheryl Walker, Keith Heck, and Simon G. Hare; Terri Wharton, Recorder

Chair Cheryl Walker called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Due to guests present agenda items were taken out of order.

**1. DEPARTMENT REPORTS & BUSINESS UPDATES**

**A. Planning**

- 1) **Ordinance No. 2016-002; An Ordinance Amending The Comprehensive Plan of Josephine County (Ordinance 81-11 As Amended), from Residential to Commercial and Amending the Zoning Map of Josephine County (Ordinance 85-1 As Amended), from Merlin-North Valley Community Residential (CR5) to Merlin-North Valley Community Commercial (CC). The Subject Property is Identified in the Josephine County Assessor's Records as Map No. T 35, R 6, Section 23, Quarter Section C0, Tax Lot 900 for Josephine County. The Property Owners Are Timm And Cheryl Andersen (Zilverberg)**

James Black, Planner III, advised there were no appeals regarding the Ordinance and was ready to move forward in order to change the zoning on the map. *Staff was directed to place the item under Legislative Actions on next week's Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

- 2) **Ordinance No. 2016-003; Repeal of an Ordinance (Ordinance 2015-001) Amending the Comprehensive Plan of Josephine County (Ordinance 81-11 As Amended), from Forest to Aggregate and Amending the Zoning Map of Josephine County (Ordinance 85-1 As Amended), from Woodlot Resource to Mineral and Aggregate Resources, and add to the Inventory of Significant Aggregate Sites for 197.34 Acres of the Property Identified as Assessor's Map T34S, R5W, Section 7, Tax Lots 1200 and 1300; and Map T34S, R5W, Section 8, Tax Lot 400. The Property Owners are Andreas and Carole Blech. Also Amending the Comprehensive Plan of Josephine County (Ordinance 81-11 As Amended), from Residential to Aggregate and Amending the Zoning Map of Josephine County (Ordinance 85-1 As Amended), from Rural Residential (RR-5) to Mineral and Aggregate Resources, and add to the Inventory of Significant Aggregate Sites For 12.49 Acres of the Property Identified as Assessor's Map T34S, R5W, Section 8, Tax Lot 1002. The Property Owner Is Blech LLC (Black)**

James Black explained the Ordinance was to repeal a previous Ordinance in order to comply with the Land Use Board of Appeals' (LUBA) decision. *Staff was directed to place the item under Legislative Actions on next week's Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

- 3) **Intergovernmental Agreement between Rogue Valley Council of Governments (RVCOG) and Josephine County for completion of Regional Farm and Forest Land Conservation Project (Black)**

James Black advised the Agreement was to contract with Dick Converse through RVCOG to complete the Southern Oregon Regional Pilot Project. Commissioner Hare asked that Executive Order 12-07 be included in the title for the Weekly Business Session. Wally Hicks, County Legal Counsel, mentioned the Agreement was signed by RVCOG April 1<sup>st</sup> and said the Board could back date it to that date. The Board agreed to back date the Agreement since Mr. Converse has already put in some hours. *Staff was directed to place the item under Administrative Actions on next week's Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

**B. Sheriff's Office**

**1) Intergovernmental Agreements between the Oregon Military Department, Office of Emergency Management and Josephine County for the Transfer of Personal Property (Krauss)**

Cory Krauss, Deputy Sheriff/SAR Coordinator, explained Josephine County Emergency Communications oversees two different radio systems, one is a high frequency voice system and the other is a data radio for contact with Salem in case of a disaster. The State received a grant to update computer systems and would now like to transfer two to the County at no cost. *Staff was directed to place the item on the Consent Calendar on next week's Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

**C. Department Updates**

**1) Fairgrounds**

Peggy Anderson, Fairgrounds Manager, distributed and reviewed **Exhibit A – Board of Commissioners Meeting Notes – April 7, 2016** with the Board.

**2) Human Resources**

JJ Scofield, Human Resources Director, reported the top candidate for the Community Development Director will be meeting with several County Departments to see if she would be a good fit. JJ advised the Elected Officials Compensation Committee met on April 6, 2016 and came up with a recommendation to be presented at the first Budget Committee Meeting.

**2. FINANCE REPORT & BUSINESS UPDATE**

**A. Economic Development Request – Illinois Valley Community Development Organization**

Arthur O'Hare explained the \$3,000 request was for the Cave Junction Park and Recreation Master Plan to upgrade the area and increase tourism. Arthur said the County gave them \$1,500 last year toward the start of the plan. Commissioner Heck questioned why the County was giving Economic Development funds for the City of Cave Junction projects when that's not done for the City of Grant Pass. Commissioner Hare agreed and said he would rather provide a Economic Development funds to use as a grant match for Jubilee Park. Arthur said he would follow up with the IVCDO regarding the Board's concerns.

**B. Economic Development Request – Illinois Valley Community Development Organization**

Arthur O'Hare explained the IVCDO is working with the State for a Parachute Infantry Battalion Historical Marker. The IVCDO has various funding lined up and is asking the County to fund \$2,200 from Economic Development funds. Commissioner Walker advised she talked with Roger Brandt, IVCDO Board Chair, and they are working on various historical types of items so people will be interested in visiting the area. The Board discussed the need to make sure these type of historical projects doesn't undermine the Illinois Valley Airport. *Staff was directed to place the item on the Consent Calendar on next week's Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

**C. Economic Development Request – Josephine County Parks**

**D. Economic Development Request – Josephine County Parks**

Arthur O'Hare advised Sarah Wright, Parks Program Manager, was applying for Economic Development Grants for Lake Selmac and Whitehorse Park. He explained there is funding available this current fiscal year even though the projects would not be incurred until next fiscal year. He suggested the Board approve the requests now to allow Sarah the leverage with other grant providers. Sarah explained when presenting grant requests to the State it is important to have a Resolution showing Board support and also to say she has 100% matching funds secured and ready to move forward. Commissioner Hare explained there are County properties he has been researching to put up for auction and was planning for the first sale in June of at least 10 properties and no more than 20. He suggested if the County were to make \$300,000 in property

sales that the \$50,000 be paid back to Economic Development. Arthur said he did have that discussion with Sarah, and the application states “up to \$50,000.” *Staff was directed to place the item under Administrative Actions on next week’s Weekly Business Session Agenda.*

Arthur O’Hare said Commissioner Walker asked him to look at the projected revenue each county would receive from the marijuana tax and distributed **Exhibit B – Estimated Distribution of Marijuana Tax Revenue**. Commissioner Walker explained she would like the Board to decide how the money will be distributed before the County receives the funds, and suggested it go to Public Safety, Public Health, and Mental Health which are the departments that will be affected by the legalization of marijuana. Commissioner Hare suggested asking the voters for a 3% tax on local marijuana and Commissioner Heck said Josephine County is the “Multnomah County” of the marijuana growers. *Staff was directed to place the Distribution of Marijuana Tax Revenue on the Administration Workshop Agenda in two weeks.*

Arthur O’Hare, reminded the Board the first Budget Committee Meeting is scheduled for April 19, 2016.

Arthur O’Hare explained Jenny Hall, Emergency Services Manager, would like to continue the NPG Grant and needs the Board to delegate signing authority to either Jenny or the Board Chair to submit the application for the \$75,000 grant.

*Commissioner Hare made a motion to authorize Commissioner Walker to sign the NPG Grant Application for \$75,000, seconded by Commissioner Heck. Upon roll call vote, motion passed 3-0; Commissioner Hare – yes, Commissioner Heck – yes, and Commissioner Walker – yes.*

**3. BOARD BUSINESS:** *(ORS 192.640(1) “. . . notice shall include a list of the principal subjects anticipated to be considered at the meeting, but this requirement shall not limit the ability of a governing body to consider additional subjects.”)*

**A. Matters from Commissioners**

Commissioner Hare mentioned a letter David Brock Smith, Curry County Commissioner, is sending to the State regarding the need to take an aggressive approach towards the Sudden Oak Death problem. Commissioner Walker suggested discussing it at the next General Discussion when the USFS and BLM are attending. Commissioner Hare said he would write a letter to the USFS and BLM advising them of the discussion.

**B. Liaison Update**

None reported.

**C. Miscellaneous Items**

None reported.

## Board of Commissioners Meeting Notes- April 7, 2016

### **Fair/Fairgrounds:**

#### **Horse Racing:**

Contract signed. We currently are starting to see some race horses come on the grounds and will expect to see temporary stalls being built and majority of horses arriving after May 7<sup>th</sup>.

#### **BMX:**

Mike Watson has given BMX a number based on the Appraiser, and considered their non-profit status on the pricing. Jennifer White has been invited to the Fair Board meeting on April 12<sup>th</sup> to give the Fair Board a presentation. Then FB recommendation will come back to Mike and Commissioners

#### **Fair:**

New main sponsor secured Tuesday with A-1 Commercial Cleaning Services taking over the janitorial and floor maintenance for a year on the Pavilion, returning sponsor Wheeler Toyota/Toyota Title Sponsor, Quality Fence, and about 10 sponsors in the process of committing for this year's fair. All acts have been hired; Grandstand, Grounds Acts and Main Stage. (See Handout)

#### **Grants:**


Mary Groves and Terry Canavello continue to work on grants. Currently working on a small set of grants for enough to cover a small child's play area. Grants written for 1 toddler spring tractor and one spring pony from rotary for about \$1,400 and asked Arthur Dubs foundation for \$700 plus for one more spring pony. Waiting to hear on all grants for floral building for approximately \$45,500 out in grants should hear in mid-April to mid-May on all grants. In conversation with Ryan yesterday we will start the face lift project on the Commercial Building and Square Dance Building by the end of the month.

#### **Grounds:**

Busy every weekend. Contracted with Ryan to take over our Lawn Mowing services, we went out for 4 bids and BOM came in to help as needed. The others would have been a set amount for 12 months. Services ranged from 450-950 a month. Josephine County Soil and Water District Master Plan is in final stages to put a permanent display for 2 years including maintenance on 5 flower beds with special emphasis on a fire resistant garden for areas that pose high fire risk of what to plant around homes. Another full house this weekend at fairgrounds. We have the Oath-keepers coming in April 15-17 to help with grounds improvements and clean up and June 25<sup>th</sup> we have made arrangements with Serve Grants Pass to work on the grounds with anywhere from 75-100 volunteers. That day will be a day that Horse racing is being run so they will be all on the fairgrounds side due to Oregon racing Commission rules that only licensed personnel can be anywhere horses are being boarded or trained. Home Depot has donated paint for the Pavilion and the Kiwanis will be painting the inside of the building sometime within the next several weeks.


We ended in April with a nice cash flow with expectations to finish year end in a positive manner.







After his humble beginnings growing up on a dairy farm in central California, John Borba took his passion for tractor pulling to little fields and county fair arenas around California in the early seventies.




