WHEREAS, at the May 16, 2000 election, the voters of Josephine County approved County Measure 17.73 (Board of County Commissioners Order No. 2000-25 dated March 13, 2000) establishing a uniform procedure for setting fees charged by Josephine County in compliance with the Josephine County Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, by Order No. 2016-047, set a time and place for a hearing to allow public comment prior to adopting fee schedules for certain County programs: and

WHEREAS, following due and proper notice, the Board of Commissioners, having heard this matter at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 9, 2016 (continued to Tuesday, November 22, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.) at a public hearing on the proposed fees does make the following FINDINGS:

(1) The proposed fees, as set out in the Exhibit attached hereto, for the following County programs: Community Development, are consistent with the intent of the measure establishing a uniform procedure for setting fees charged by the County; the provision of the services will be borne by the users of the services and not by the taxpayers and general fund of Josephine County; and

(2) The cost of the proposed fees is calculated to cover the cost of providing the services and administration of the programs directly related to the proposed fees.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:



## **COMM. DEV. FEE SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING ADDENDUM**

### **Line 7: Annual Compliance Inspection -- Proposed \$20/plant**

Original Text: "With OLCC and OMMP not inspecting, we will inspect. Annual inspection saves time when we receive complaints because we will know which sites have been looked at and whether in compliance. If in compliance, and later in violation, compliance can be revoked and they need to reapply once in compliance again. Requires background check, so 50% of fee to go to Sheriff. 25% to go to Parole and Probation. 25% to fund Department Code Enforcement Administrator. (Est. \$100,000 x .25)." (Note: Staff proposes no changes to this other than the percentage for Parole and Probation and Community Development.)

Proposed Certificate Details: Some growers have considered a self-imposed compliance fee they would in turn give to law enforcement. The fee would be to cover a compliance check, and the compliant farm would get a sticker or certificate they could post at the road so law enforcement knew the site had been cleared as being in compliance, and there wasn't a need to inspect. The thought was this would free up law enforcement to address the grows with legal problems. This would also help fund what some growers deem as needed law enforcement. This idea made sense to the Community Development Director, but she saw how a slight modification could help the grower with land use issues as well, while also helping county staff with responses to complaints.

The proposal is a voluntary compliance program whereby the grower pays an annual fee for an inspection. If not in compliance, we work with them until they are in compliance with the RLDC/BS. Once in compliance, or if they always were, we issue the annual certificate they can display. As people drive by and see alleged violations, they'll know what they see isn't a violation, and not to bother the farmer, or call us. If they do call us, we can explain we inspected the property and the farm is in compliance. If we get repeated calls, we know not to waste time re-inspecting repeatedly, rather, to let the caller know we have checked them and they are in compliance. This in turn frees up staff time to inspect other allegations (complaints).

If we happen to be in the area and drive by and see the farm is no longer in compliance, we revoke the certificate, and there is no refund (staff time is already expensed). They of course have to work with us to come into 're-compliance'. They get one shot at a compliance certificate a year; they don't get multiple chances to get a new certificate.

This could be renewed annually, voluntarily again, upon fee and re-inspection. If they also request a background check, the fee is higher and the Sheriff's Department certify the certificate as well. OLCC and OHA also require compliance with local laws, and the certificates will be used to verify

compliance for those agencies, if requested.

Fee Proposal: \$20/plant, maximum of \$200 < 1acre parcel; \$400 < 10 acre; \$500 > 10 acre. (more land to inspect). (Original details on the per plant fee were not finalized, but after feedback from two individuals, it is being recommended as the final draft, and to have a sliding scale, and maximums). If a background check is requested, there shall be another \$150 fee per license or card holder for the property.

Originally it was proposed a portion of the compliance fee go to Parole and Probation, but that is only because they were included on state breakdowns; they have been removed from this proposed fee structure. 50% of the fee is to go to Community Development for their time; 50% to law enforcement to cover the background check and because they often have to assist staff on inspections.


This proposal also helps relieve the 'multiple inspection' burden put on taxpayers (with no citation authority, taxpayers currently pay 100% of the current compliance/complaint program).

**Line 8: Appeal Fee -- Originally proposed at \$400**

ORS 215.416(11)(b) caps this fee at \$250. Do not change.

**Line 36: Violation Citation – Up to \$1000**

Applicable only if RLDC or JCC is amended to authorize citation authority. Having this in the fee schedule does not authorize the amendment, rather it establishes a fee and revenue projection *if* codes are amended to grant citation authority.



WHEREAS, this matter has come before the Josephine County Board of Commissioners at the request of the Board of Directors for Josephine Community Libraries, Inc. (JCLI), a public benefit non-profit corporation, which has provided library services to Josephine County citizens since December of 2008, after county libraries were closed in May of 2007, due to lack of county government funding; and

WHEREAS, the JCLI Board has informed the BCC that funding for the library is provided solely by donations and grants; and that the current level of donations and grants is insufficient to meet the increased public demand for library services; and

WHEREAS, the JCLI Board has proposed the formation of a library district, which would provide and sustain an adequate level of library service throughout Josephine County, with a permanent tax rate that would provide a stable and consistent source of revenue; and

WHEREAS, the JCLI Board has requested that the Board of Commissioners initiate formation of a special district for library services and place the question of district formation on the ballot for the May 16, 2017, election; and

WHEREAS, ORS 198.835 authorizes and provides the procedures whereby the Board of County Commissioners may initiate the formation of a district by Order of the Board; and

WHEREAS, ORS 357.216 to 357.286 is the Principal Act, which authorizes and provides for the formation of a library district; and

WHEREAS, the Josephine County Board of Commissioners finds that it is in the public interest to initiate the formation of a library district, effective upon approval of the voters at the May 16, 2017, election, which proposed district will include non-contiguous territory within Josephine County, including all territory within the incorporated cities of Grants Pass and Cave Junction; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 198.835(3), attached is a certified copy of a resolution of the City of Grants Pass (Exhibit 1), and a resolution of the City of Cave Junction (Exhibit 2), approving this initiation order;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. The Board of County Commissioners declares its intention to initiate formation of a library district pursuant to ORS Chapter 357.216 to 357.286, for the purpose of providing library services in non-contiguous territory within Josephine County, including all territory within the incorporated cities of Grants Pass and Cave Junction, effective upon approval of the voters at the May 16, 2017, election.

2. The name of the proposed library district is the **Josephine Community Library District**.

3. The proposed library district shall have as its boundary non-contiguous territory within Josephine County, including all territory within the incorporated cities of Grants Pass and Cave Junction; the boundary is more particularly described and depicted in Exhibit 3 (description and maps), attached hereto and incorporated herein.

4. The proposed library district shall have the general powers granted by ORS Chapter 357.216 to 357.286 (the "Principal Act") and the specific powers granted by ORS 357.261.

5. The electors in the proposed District will be asked whether the district should be formed and whether the proposed permanent tax rate limit of \$0.39 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation shall be adopted as the maximum rate of operating taxes for the district.

6. The governing body of the proposed district will be a five-member district board elected at large, by position number, by the electors of the proposed district (ORS 357.241) at the election for district formation (ORS 357.231).

7. A public hearing on the proposal for formation of the **Josephine Community Library District** shall be held at the hour of **9:00 o'clock a.m. on January 25, 2017**, in the Anne Basker Auditorium, Courthouse Annex, in Grants Pass, Oregon, in accordance with ORS 198.805. At the time set for the hearing, the Board of Commissioners will hear testimony and receive written comment from all interested persons on the formation of the proposed district.

8. Notice of the foregoing public hearing shall be published in the Grants Pass Daily Courier and posted in accordance with ORS 198.730, ORS 198.800, and ORS 198.840.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. The Board of County Commissioners declares its intention to initiate formation of a county service district pursuant to ORS Chapter 451.010(1)(n), for the purpose of providing law enforcement services in Josephine County, including all territory within the incorporated cities of Grants Pass and Cave Junction, effective upon approval of the voters at the May 16, 2017, election.
2. The name of the proposed county service district is the **Josephine County Law Enforcement District**.
3. The proposed county service district shall have as its boundary all of the territory within Josephine County as described in ORS 201.170, including all territory within the incorporated cities of Grants Pass and Cave Junction; as more particularly described and depicted in Exhibit 3 (description and maps), attached hereto and incorporated herein.
4. The proposed county service District shall have the general powers granted by ORS Chapter 451 (the "Principal Act") and the specific powers granted by ORS 451.550. The proposed District will provide law enforcement services per ORS 451.010(1)(n).
5. The electors in the proposed District will be asked whether the district should be formed and whether the proposed permanent tax rate limit of \$0.93 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation shall be adopted as the maximum rate of operating taxes for the district, as authorized by ORS 451.547

6. The Josephine County Board of Commissioners will serve as the governing body of the proposed district, pursuant to ORS 451.485.



**201.170 Josephine County.** The boundary of Josephine County is as follows: Beginning at the east quarter corner of section 13, township 33 south, range 5 west, Willamette Meridian, which point is on the range line between ranges 4 and 5; thence west one mile; north one and one-half miles; west one and one-fourth miles; north one-half mile; west one and three-fourths miles; south one-fourth mile; west one mile; north one-fourth mile; west two miles; north one-half mile; west one-fourth mile; south one mile; west one and one-half miles; south one mile; west one-fourth mile; north one-fourth mile; west one mile; south one-fourth mile; west one mile; south one-half mile; west one-half mile; south one-fourth mile; west one-half mile; north on the range line between ranges 6 and 7 to the east quarter corner of section 13, township 33 south, range 7 west; thence west one and one-half miles; north one-half mile; west two and one-half miles; north one-half mile; west one mile; north one-half mile; west one-fourth mile; north three-fourths mile; west one-fourth mile; south one-fourth mile; west one-half mile; north to the township line; west on the township line to the southeast corner of section 31, township 32 south, range 8 west; thence north three-fourths mile; west one-half mile; north one-fourth mile; west one-half mile to the range line; south to the southwest corner of section 31, township 32 south, range 8 west; thence west to the southwest corner of section 36, township 32 south, range 9 west; thence north to a point on the line separating Douglas County on the north from Curry County on the south and due north of the head of Kelsey Canyon; thence down Kelsey Canyon to Rogue River; thence on a straight line to the head of a prominent butte situate on the top of the dividing ridge between the waters of Rogue River and Indigo Creek, and about two miles northeast of Bear Camp; thence to the nearest waters of Indigo Creek; thence following down Indigo Creek to the Illinois River; thence up the Illinois River to the mouth of Collier Creek; thence up Collier Creek and up the south branch of such creek to the top of the dividing ridge separating the waters of the Illinois River on the east from the waters of the Chetco River and the north fork of Smith River on the west; thence following along on the divide to the south boundary of the state; thence east along the boundary to the range line between townships 4 and 5, west of Willamette Meridian; thence north to the place of beginning.
